1.02 SUMMARY OF THE WORK

- A. This project consists of the removal and replacement of approximately 70 decorative lights within downtown Pulaski. Contractor will be responsible for all coordination with Pulaski Electric System and all labor, equipment and materials to complete the project in accordance with current electrical codes.
- C. Contract time to complete this project is 90 days.

1.03 EXECUTION AND COORDINATION OF THE WORK

- A. All work shall be coordinate with the City of Pulaski, Pulaski Electric System, and the local State of Tennessee Electrical Inspector.
- B. The existing lights are fed from fifteen (15) different locations and each location will require a meter base, overcurrent protection, and any other work and material required, to meet Pulaski Electric and State Electrical inspector's requirements.
- C. Each service shall be looked at with Pulaski Electric System's Engineering Department to determine location of each service location.
- D. Each service location must be inspected and approved by the State Electrical Inspector. Permits for each service are the responsibility of the contractor and should be purchased before work is started.
- E. Pulaski Electric System will cut each service location loose when needed, and reconnect when needed, at no charge to the contractor if done during regular business hours.
- F. Work shall be performed so as to limit downtime of lighting at night.
- G. The Contractor shall be responsible for the removal and disposal of all posts, lighting, and any other materials being removed.

- H. Bolt pattern of new posts should match the existing concrete bases or contractor shall furnish suitable transition plates.

1.04 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. **Manufacturers Qualifications:** The manufacturers of all materials and equipment used must be reputable and regularly engaged in the manufacture of the particular material or equipment for the use and service to which it will be subjected.
- B. **Compliance With State and Local Laws:** Comply with all applicable requirements of state and local laws and ordinances to the extent that such requirements do not conflict with federal laws or regulations.
- C. **Protection of Public and Private Property:** Take special care in working areas to protect public and private property. Contractor shall determine exact location of all existing utilities prior to beginning construction in accordance with State of Tennessee, *Title 65 – Public Utilities and Carriers, Chapter 31 Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act*. The contractor shall replace or repair at his own expense any damaged utility pipes, power and communication lines, or other public utilities, roads, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, drain pipes, drainage ditches, all properties and fixtures (both permanent and temporary) fences, and all plantings, including grass or sod on the site of the work. Leave the site in original or better condition after all cleanup work has been done.
- D. **Markers:** Preserve all USGS, TVA, TDOT, and State of Tennessee property markers and private markers. Do not remove or disturb any such markers without prior approval from the Owner. Any removal and replacement of such markers shall be at the expense of the Contractor.
- E. **Non-discrimination:** The Contractor agrees to hire qualified persons without regard to race, creed, color, sex, or national origin for the performance of the work specified in this contract.
- F. **Drawings of Record:** Provide a complete, up-to-date record set of prints, which shall be corrected daily to show every change, and the approved shop drawings. Keep this set of prints at the job site and use only as a record set. The drawings shall be delivered to the Engineer and verified before submittal to the Owner. Final payment will not be released until as-built drawings are provided.
